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
Purpose



Update on Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Program 2022 Budget.



- AIS program requires inspection and purchase of a sticker to launch to prevent the introduction of AIS
 - Three stations Meyers, Spooner Summit, Alpine Meadows
- Mud, plants, animal, water
- Decontamination if needed
- Stickers and seals
- Seal inspectors at ramps

Program Successes



- Gold standard
- No new invasives since program began
- Contract with Tahoe Resource
- **Conservation District**
- Program steadily growing, adapting to challenges and making modifications to improve





Budget Background



- Rising costs over the last few years
- The Lake Tahoe AIS Boat Inspection program faced budget shortfalls
- Staff developed long-term budget strategy in collaboration with partners

LAKE TAHOE INVASIVE SPECIES Secured Funding Sources



The program was able to secure several new funding sources including:

- CA Department of Boating and Waterways grant for staffing the Meyers Station - \$399K to the end of 2022
- CA Department of Boating and Waterways grant for staffing the Alpine Station
 \$399K to the end of 2023
- Appointment System
 - \$51K in 2021
- Aquatic Nuisance Species Task Force
 - \$92K annually
- Lake Tahoe Restoration Act funds if needed
 - Up to \$300,000 annually



Cost Saving Measures



Operating three inspections instead of four in 2021 and 2022

• Savings = ~\$119,000

Program staff will make adjustments:

- As needed to address any unexpected shortfalls
- Will continue to investigate:
 - program improvements
 - cost saving measures and
 - revenue sources to ensure program sustainability.

The program will continue to apply for grants annually.







The program has stable funding for the next three calendar years.

Operating budget of approximately \$2 million



Summary



- Maintaining the highest level of protections and provide excellent customer service
 - Competitive wages to get dedicated, well-trained staff
 - Pays dividends in long-term
- Addressed short- and long-term funding challenges
- Continue to work on long-term program solvency
