

## **BMP Action Plan Discussion Topics**

- 2. Require BMPs at the point-of-sale
- 3. Use of forfeited securities
- Enforcement options, such as recording a notice of noncompliance to a property
- Prioritize BMP implementation in coordination with Load Reduction Plans
- 6. Area-wide BMPs and in-lieu fees
- 7. Additional incentives/subsidies
- 8. BMP maintenance and adaptive management
- 9. Additional topics of interest





### Real Estate Transaction BMP Requirements

- 1. Real Estate disclosure process
- 2. Require BMPs at the point-of-sale

- 1.1 Enhance BMP Real Estate Disclosure form
- 2.1 Develop a robust disclosure process and BMP education and outreach at the point-of-sale
- 2.2 Support the TMDL with BMP Compliance Efforts



## Compliance Procedures and Enforcement Options

- 3. Use of forfeited securities
- 4. Enforcement options, such as recording a notice of noncompliance to a property

- 3.1 Request TRPA Legal Committee review of Code amendments to provide greater flexibility in the use of forfeited securities.
- 4.1 Request Legal Committee review of Rules of Procedure amendments to record a notice of non-compliance to a property deed under certain circumstances.
- 4.2 Improve enforcement tracking and reporting

## Coordinate BMP Implementation with Load Reduction Plans

5. Prioritize BMP implementation in coordination with Load Reduction Plans

- 5.1 Update the TRPA enforcement strategy
- 5.2 Update the Charter and Strategic Plan for the EIP Parcel Specific Working Group
- 5.3 Improve BMP Compliance Tracking and Reporting





### Area-Wide Water Quality Treatment

6. Area-wide BMPs and in-lieu fees

- 6.1 Incorporate area-wide treatment opportunities into Area Plans
- 6.2 Track and report BMP certificates from area-wide treatment





#### **BMP** Incentives

7. Seek funding for additional incentives to encourage BMP compliance, such as a robust subsidy program through reimbursements.

- 7.1 Evaluate BMP incentives during four-year update and adapt as needed
- 7.2 Pursue new grant funds for incentive programs
- 7.3 Partner with entities like the League to Save Lake Tahoe to leverage communication and outreach efforts to increase use of incentives





## 8. BMP Maintenance and Adaptive Management

- 8.1 Update maintenance section of the BMP Handbook to align with the TMDL
- 8.2 BMP Maintenance Plan for all permitted commercial and multi-family projects
- 8.3 Regional Plan adaptive management process





## 9. Additional Topics of Interest

Marinas, Hydrologic Connectivity, BMPs on Vacant Lots, Subsurface Contamination

- 9.1 Issue BMP Certs for marinas in compliance with state NPDES requirements
- 9.2 Consider targeting non-compliant marinas in coordination with Lahontan and NDEP
- 9.3 Focus resources and staff time on strategies that achieve the greatest pollutant load reduction while minimizing risk of spreading subsurface contamination
